

Public Notice

On Thursday, July 30th 2009, from 9:00AM to 3:00PM the City of Brunswick will allow any interested private citizen to obtain parts of the 400 year old historic oak that fell down in the 800 block of Union St. on June 30th. By state statute we are unable to give the tree away so we are going to charge \$1.00 per load. We will accept checks or money orders on site. The checks should be made payable to the City of Brunswick. The tree has been removed to the City's compound located in Beverly Shores off of Bishop St. Interested individuals will be able to remove up to one load of the oak tree and will have up to one hour to do so. Individuals may bring the equipment necessary to do the work as the City will not provide tools or labor. Access to the tree will be on a first come, first served basis, and all people accessing the tree will be required to sign a waiver absolving the City of Brunswick of all liability. The City reserves the right to halt any unsafe practices in the extraction of the oak tree and may allow more than one load or additional time depending on the demand.
